

Reaching out without taking back (GENEROSITY), builds and maintains positive interpersonal relationships (BELONGING), and teaches selfless and socially responsible action (INDEPENDENCE). Others, appreciating the generous actions, invite peers to socially engage with them (BELONGING), while each modelling their talents, knowledge, and wisdom to the others (MASTERY).







# **Makey Makeys**

Our Grade 5/6 students in Mr. Kelly's class participated in a Makey Makeys workshop with our Teacher Librarian, Tracy Walker.

The grade five and six students made simple computer games more complex with the use of Makey Makeys. These devices replace any keyboard using electric conductors and simple circuits. Students can create things from musical instruments to game controllers. Our students created interactive remote controls to play their games.
